He was very helpful and well informed about our situation and he explained that Road Service have an A list and a B list when it comes to the priority of gritting, with A being essential routes of all the various sorts and B including areas where people are easily trapped by ice and snow. List A is kept open first, and then list B as resources allow. He agreed to move Edenderry to the top of list B, and promised to keep the road clear of snow and gritted, rather than let it become compacted as happened last year. If he doesn't, we have his direct phone number.
